These consolidated proceedings were brought by the Secretary of Labor for civil penalties under the Federal Mine Safety and Health Act of 1977, 30 U.S.C. 801 et seq.

At the beginning of the hearing the parties moved for approval of a settlement that would have included reduction of the proposed penalties from \$7,100 to \$5,400 and changing two 104(d)(1) orders to 104(a) citations.

The settlement was approved in part and denied in part. Testimony of the federal mine inspector and documentary evidence from the government were then received concerning the two 104(d)(1) orders. Further discussions on and off the record le to an amendment to the settlement motion to propose settlement at the original assessments for the two 104(d)(1) orders without changing the orders and total payment of \$6,800. The amended motion was approved in a bench decision. This Decision confirms the bench decision.
