FEDERAL MINE SAFETY AND HEALTH REVIEW COMMISSION NOTICE OF RIGHTS: ACCESSIBILITY OF TECHNOLOGY AND FACILITIES

SECTION 508 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT (29 U.S.C. § 794d)

Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act requires federal agencies to ensure that all electronic and information technology is accessible to individuals with disabilities to the same extent that the technology is accessible to individuals without disabilities, unless doing so would impose an undue burden on the agency. Examples of electronic and information technology include websites, e-filing systems, and telephones. Where it would impose an undue burden to develop and maintain technology which meets this standard, agencies are required to provide the relevant electronic information to individuals with disabilities by alternative means. This right of accessibility applies to employees and members of the public. Further information regarding Section 508 and standards for compliance may be found at www.section508.gov.

ARCHITECTURAL BARRIERS ACT (42 U.S.C. §§ 4151-4157)

Pursuant to the Architectural Barriers Act ("ABA"), any facility constructed, altered, leased or financed by the United States shall whenever possible be designed, constructed and/or altered to ensure ready access by individuals with physical disabilities.
